
RHYS BERNIER - Fin

Andrew was part of the 2009 Director's Lab at the Lincoln Center Theater in New York and the 2018 Director's Lab Chicago. A graduate of Concordia University, Andrew trained at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre in London, England and spent five seasons as the Director of Education at Tarragon Theatre.



DAVE DEVEAU - Playwright

Dave Deveau is a Vancouver-based award-winning writer and performer whose work has been produced across North America and in Europe. He is the Playwright in Residence for Zee Zee Theatre who have produced five of his plays including My Funny Valentine and Elbow Room Café: The Musical (with Anton Lipovetsky). His first three theatre for young audiences plays were all commissioned and premiered by Green Thumb Theatre and have subsequently continued into other productions: Out in the Open, tagged, and Celestial Being. He is currently working on new commissions for Zee Zee Theatre, The Belfry, Arts Club, and Nashville Children's Theatre. His plays have been nominated for 4 Doras (including Outstanding Play for Ladies and Gentlemen, Boys and Girls) and 21 Jessies. 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
