
PAUL DUNN - Playwright

He co-authored The Gay Heritage Project which was nominated for a 2014 Dora Award for Outstanding New Play. He is a graduate of the Theatre Arts Program at Grant MacEwan College, and the Acting Program at the National Theatre School. Outside was nominated for a 2015 Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding New Play (TYA) and is published by Playwrights Canada Press.



RYAN DAVY - Stage Manager

Ryan Davy (He/Him) holds a degree in Stage Management from the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in Glasgow and a Diploma in Television Broadcasting from Seneca College.
